How Parents Can Help

- Please read to your child every day and comment in their reading record.
- Book bags containing reading records and books to be in school **every day**.
- Learn number bonds up to 10
- Practise writing their name.
- Complete home learning on Teams
- **PE days: Mondays & Wednesdays**



COMMUNICATION & LANGUAGE

- The children will hold conversation when engaged in back-and-forth exchanges with their teacher and peers.
- They will participate in small group, class and one-to-one discussions, offering their own ideas, using recently introduced vocabulary.
- They will begin to offer explanations for why things might happen, making use of recently introduced vocabulary from stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems when appropriate.



PERSONAL, SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- The children will understand how to build constructive and respectful relationships.
- They will express their feelings and consider the feelings of others.
- The children will think about the perspective of others.
- They will also express their feelings and consider the feelings of others.



PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

- The children will practice and further develop their fundamental movement skills during their PE lessons. They will develop these skills by playing a variety of games.
- Through PE lessons the children will start to understand how to work as a team, take turns, keep the score, play against an opponent and play by the rules.



MATHEMATICS

- The children will explore the composition of numbers to 10.
- They will practise automatically recalling number bonds for numbers 0–10.
- They will continue to explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10, including how quantities can be distributed equally.
- They will also compare length, weight and capacity.



LITERACY

- The children will continue to write short sentences with words with known letter-sound correspondences using a capital letter and full stop.
- They will practice re-reading what they have written to check that it makes sense.
- They will continue to use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems and during role play.
- The children will spell words by identifying sounds in them
- They will write simple phrases and sentences that can be read by others

PHONICS

- **Review** Read, Write Inc's Set 1 sounds and reading words with the sounds they know.
- **Learn sounds** Read Write Inc Set 2 sounds
- *The children will also learn how to use their phonic knowledge to read nonsense (alien) words.*

UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORLD

- Children will explore seasonal changes focussing on Summer
- They will explore the natural world around them.
- They will begin to understand how to draw information from a simple map.
- Children will explore environments and recognise that some are different to the one in which they live.
- Through the topic, Our World, the children will explore and being to understand what makes the world they live in.

EXPRESSIVE ART & DESIGN

- Children will use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function
- They will share their creations, explaining the process they have used.
